Nothing but a plastic replica bird; to whom they often feed, perform courtship displays to and event mount in their despair. However cute it may seem: this behaviour makes them ill. Often inflammation of the crop can occur, which can sometimes prove fatal. The budgie needs a companion and if you decide to keep a budgie, you should buy at least two for the mutual benefit of the creatures.
